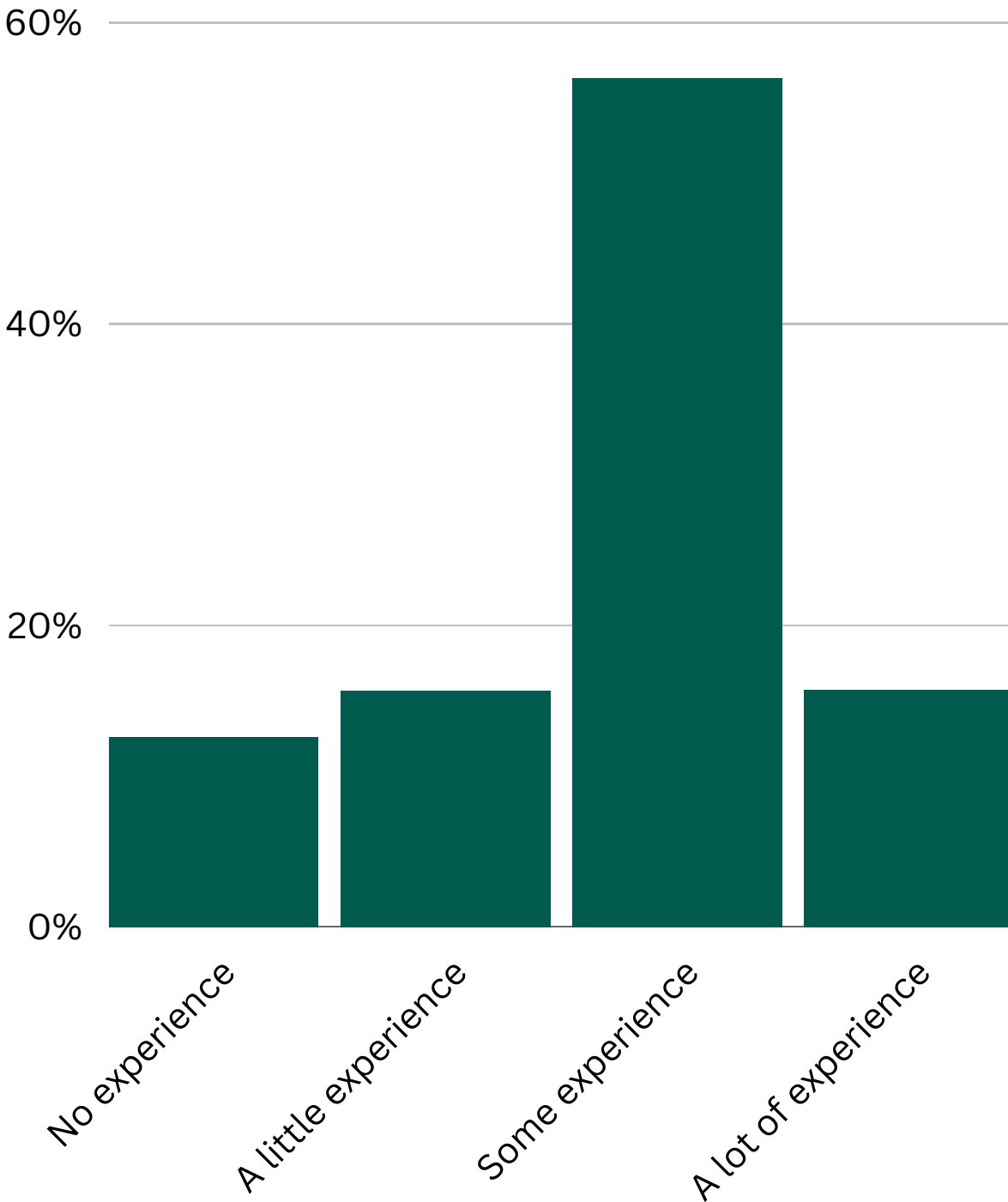

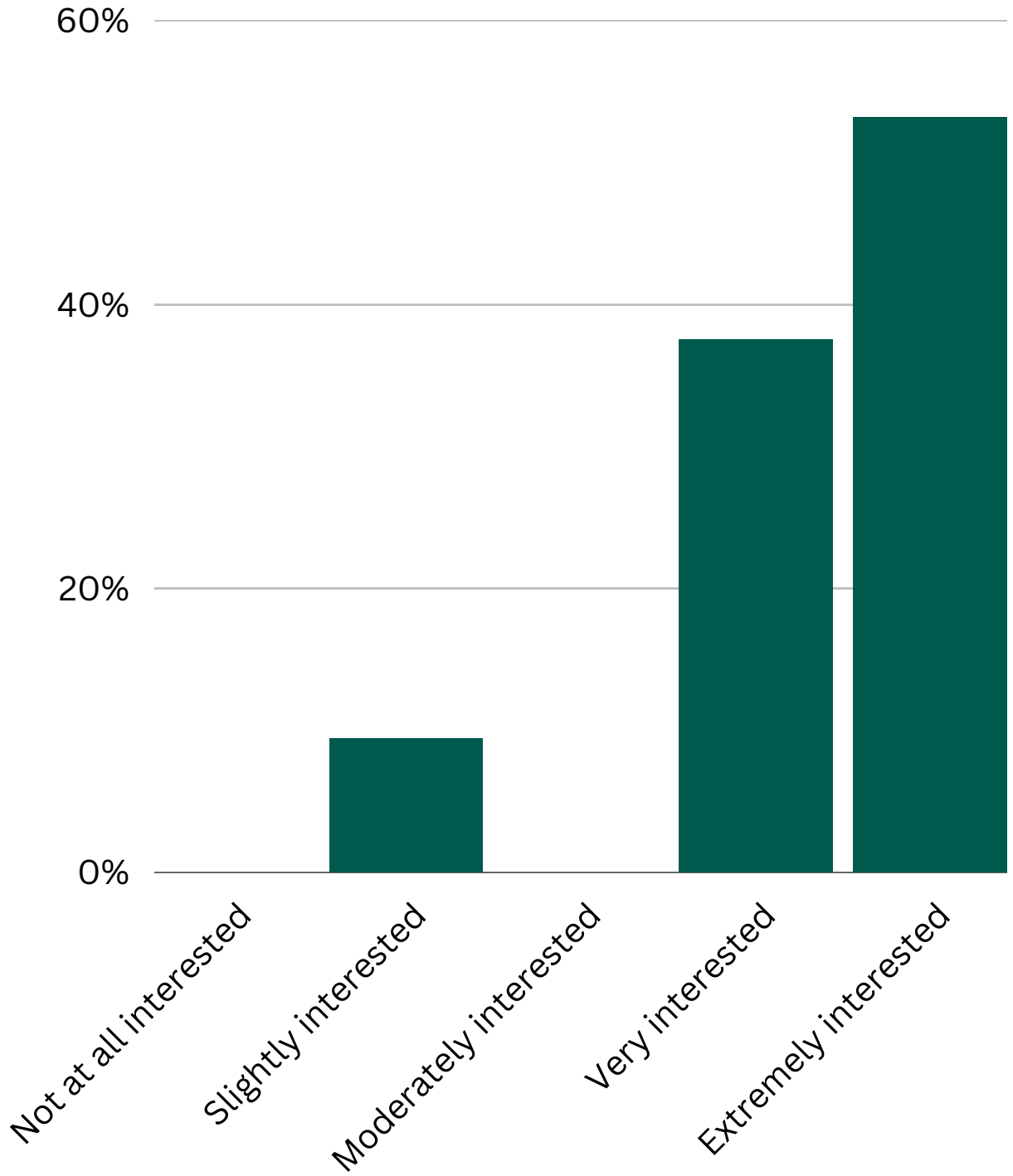

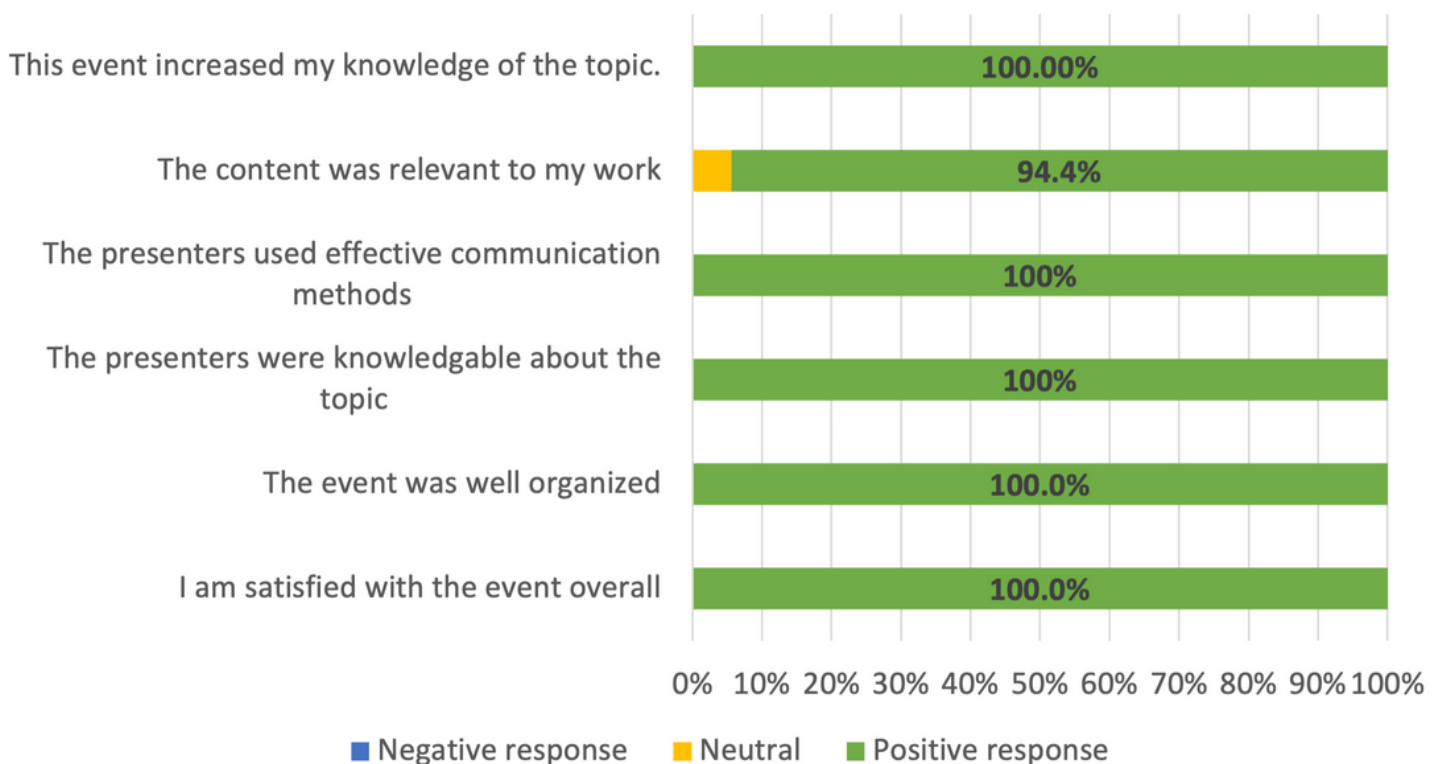

"Consider developing several short Public Service Announcements on the benefits for local Network T V."

What specific challenges need to be addressed to foster and improve community-engagement with research at Wayne State University?

"Getting more faculty members involved. Going to the School of Medicine and talking to different departments."

"Knowing you are there for us to engage with research at WSU"

"Publicize results in the community as actively as you recruit participants."

"The endless research and studies are futile. We know the issues. We're aware of the inequities. Research what "doing the work" looks like."

"Building trust, providing ample information and consistent trauma informed care."

"Clarify all Medical/Research Acronyms and Jargon across all communications"

"Orgs/ Agencies representatives to the table (panels, virtual, in-person presentations)"
