





Which best describes you? (mark all that apply)



What specific challenges need to be addressed to foster and improve community-engagement with research at Wayne State University?

"Publicity and training"

"Connecting with the community, we realize technology is relied on to connect with the community, however there are many who are not connected with technology that need direct contact with possible. Also to connect with those already out in the community to assist"

"For community-engaged scholars (junior in particular) find a way to fit community-engaged work into the tenure process. Community-engaged work takes a lot of time at the front end to build good relationships and sometimes the big grants and big publications that come down the line don't happen right away. Land grant universities do this really well."

"Share their finding and let the community benefit from the results of the research. Intervention."
